Aggressive misbehavior Toward any school employee	Physical contact or threat of physical contact toward school employee(s) with the intention of doing bodily harm by a student of students.	_____
Arson/ Attempted Arson	Starting a fire within the school or on the school grounds, for any purpose that results in destruction or disruption.	(1) Notification of Legal authorities
Bomb Threat	Making a threat that a bomb has been placed, or is about to explode, in a school.	and
False Fire Alarm	Falsely alerting the Fire Department, or school of a non-existing fire.	(2) Recommendation Of extended suspension or expulsion
Possession or use of weapons or look alike	The possession of any instrument such as fireworks, explosives, knives, clubs, chains and the like that can be used to inflict bodily injury to another person. Federal Law requires a mandatory expulsion of one year for certain types of weapon possession offenses.	
Use of, possession of or under the influence of Alcoholic beverages or Or other illegal substance	Alcoholic beverages include any beverage with alcoholic content. Illegal substances include dangerous drugs, narcotics, marijuana, barbiturates, amphetamines, look alike drugs, related paraphernalia and any other material that has a harmful or unnatural effect on the person using them. Possession includes backpack, clothing or other items, items found in the locker assigned to the student or in the student's car. The school also prohibits the misuse of over-the-counter drugs and/or prescription drugs.	_____

Cheating	The act of cheating on tests and assignments, Including copying and plagiarism.	Detention or Alternative Education Room
Destruction or defacement of school property.	The destroying or mutilating of objects or material of the school district.	(1) Restitution and/or repair (2) AER Room or Suspension (3) Notify authorities if warranted
Electronic Devices	Electronic devices which may disrupt the learning environment are not allowed during class time. This includes, but is not limited to cell phones, Radios, tape players, CD/DVD players, pagers and laser pointers.	Teacher warning, confiscation of item for the class period, and lunch detention. AER for three offences
Fighting	When students willfully engage in physical contact for the purpose of inflicting harm on the other person(s) and notification of authorities.	AER room or Suspension
Forgery	The act of falsely using the name of another Person, or falsify documents or correspondence To or from the school.	AER room or Suspension
Gambling	Participating in games of chance for the Expressed purpose of exchanging money.	Detention, AER or Suspension as warranted
Gang Activity	Students are prohibited from engaging in gang activity, including but not limited to gang symbols, gestures or clothing.	Detention, AER or suspension The seriousness of the offense shall Determine the consequences.

Gross Defiance	Belligerent disrespectful behavior toward any school personnel, disruption of school environment or Disregarding school rules.	Referral to the office and possible detention, AER, suspension or expulsion as warranted
Improper Language	Cursing, using profanity or improper body language	Referral to the office and possible detention, AER, suspension, or expulsion as warranted.
Intimidation/Malicious	To willfully intimidate, insult, or in another manner abuse verbally or in writing any member of the school staff or student body. This includes incidents of sexual or racial harassment.	Referral to the office and possible detention, AER, suspension, or expulsion as warranted
Public Display of Affection	Inappropriate displays of affection on school property	Referral to the office as a warning. Repeated offenses will result in detention, AER room or suspension
Tobacco	The possession or use of tobacco products on school Property or at school functions is prohibited	1 st time-AER and turn name into authorities 2 nd time-2 days AER and name into Authorities
Theft	No student may steal another person's property or School property	(1) Return of stolen property or compensation (2) AER or suspension as warranted (3) Possible notification of authorities
Unsafe Actions	Using any form or type of aggressive behavior that does physical or psychological harm to someone else And/or urging other students to engage in such conduct. Prohibited aggressive behavior includes, without limitation, The use of violence, force, noise, coercion, threats, Intimidation, fear, bullying, or their comparable conduct.	Referral to the office and possible detention, AER, suspension, or expulsion as warranted.

Admit Slip Procedure

All students should check posted attendance.

A student who must be sent from the class to receive an admit slip will be counted tardy.

Not signing out

Students must receive permission from the office to sign out when leaving during the school day.

Detention. Consequences will be escalated for repeated offenses.

Tardiness

Arriving to a class or assigned area after the tardy bell.

After the 4th tardy a lunch detention will be assigned. After the 6th tardy AER will be assigned per semester. Consequences may be escalated for repeated offenses.

Truancy

Absence from school without permission and/or knowledge of parent and/or school officials.

Detention: Consequences will be escalated for repeated offenses.
